### Acrylic Paints



**Master's Touch** are on sale 50% every other week. Catch it right and you can pick these up for about \$2.00 per tube. This is a HUGE savings!



**Liquitex Basics** are about a dollar a tube more expensive than Master's Touch.

*\*You can also buy these paints in smaller sets that may or may not have all these colors. It's worth looking into.*



## Paint Brushes



**Master's Touch** brushes are also on sale 50% off every other week. The white or gold taklon should work well. I recommend **Flat** in sizes #12, 6, and 2, a script or liner brush and a small round bristle brush for sketching your painting.

## Canvas



**Master's Touch** canvas works great. I prefer the texture of watercolor canvas, but that is just me. 9x12" should be good. These come in a five pack so you can split the costs with another student if you like. **These too are on sale every other week at 50% off!**

## Palette



Master's Touch. I use a glass palette most of the time, but these inexpensive paper palettes work wonderfully and they are cheap.

Come with a good attitude and be prepared to have fun and learn!

Bring anything else you like to paint with.

**Plein Air**

**Easel-** Any sturdy easel or tripod that will hold your paper/board and allow you to paint vertical to flat should be good. A shelf attached to the legs to hold palette, water and brushes is beneficial.

**Umbrella-** Great to have, but you can make do without. They are expensive and come in a variety of attachment styles.

**Chair or stool-** If you can't stand for a few hours to paint you may want something to sit on. Lightweight and collapsible is best.

**Miscellaneous-** Jacket, hat, sunglasses, sunscreen and repellent. You will be outside in ALL KINDS of weather. Be prepared.
