Ozarks Studies Symposium— "Marginal Voices of the Ozarks" Friday and Saturday, September 22 and 23, 2017

The theme of the eleventh annual Ozarks Studies Symposium is "Marginal Voices of the Ozarks." All presentations will be held at the West Plains Civic Center, are free of charge, and everyone is invited to attend.

The symposium will feature presentations by scholars, writers, artists and musicians who will provide insight into many facets of the Ozarks.

Dr. Jason McCollom, assistant professor of History at MSU-WP and symposium coordinator emphasized the exciting slate of presenters. "This year's theme is 'Marginal Voices of the Ozarks,'" he said, "and the community can learn about a variety of seemingly ignored people throughout the region's history. From the back-to-the-landers of the 1970s to Jewish Ozarkers to the African American history here in West Plains—and even haiku in the Ozarks—I think this year's topics will open our eyes to a hidden history of this place we call home."

Keynote Address: "Good Times and Sorrow: An Oral **History Project**"



The symposium's keynote address will be given at 4 p.m. Friday, Sept. 22, by Susan Young, outreach coordinator at the Shiloh Museum of Ozark History in Springdale, AR. Susan is a lifelong resident of Fayetteville and a fifthgeneration Ozarker.

She is the author of **So Big, This Little** Place, a history of the founding of Tontitown, Arkansas, and the editor of **Memories I Can't Let Go Of**, a collection

of life stories from Tontitown, Arkansas.

Susan serves on the boards of the Arkansas Historical Association and the Ozark Folk Cultural Center Commission.

Her Ozark history interests include traditional folkways, religion and cemeteries.
