Craft brewers, distributors, and area restaurants and farmers' markets will highlight the 7th Annual West Plains Brew-Fest, set for 5:30 to 8 p.m. Saturday, March 9, 2019, in the Arena and Exhibit Hall at the West Plains Civic Center. Doors will open promptly at 5:30.

The full Arena will be used to accommodate the needs of this event. The first 700 people through the door will receive a souvenir 2019 tasting glass, and all attendees will be eligible for door prize giveaways, which will include t-shirts, glasses, growlers, gift certificates, and more.

Attendees will have the opportunity to sample craft beers from a wide range of breweries, organizers said. Confirmed participating Missouri craft breweries include Boulevard Brewing of Kansas City; O'Fallon Brewing of O'Fallon; Piney River Brewery of Bucyrus; Public House Brewing of Rolla; and Ostermeier Brewing and Wages Brewing of West Plains.

St. James Winery will be participating with some specially chosen wines.

Great Rivers Distributing is bringing products from Anheuser Busch, Bell's, Odell's, Springfield Brewing Company, Goose Island, O'Fallon, Kona, Four Peaks, 10 Barrel, Golden Road, and Breckenridge.

Grellner Sales & Service will feature products from Boston Beer Company, American Vintage Beverage, White Claw Seltzer Works, Boulevard Brewing Company, Corona USA, Palm Breeze Beverage Co., The Smirnoff Co., and Shiner.

In addition to the craft beers and wines, attendees will enjoy a variety of samples from many area restaurants and farmers market members. GATEWOOD FAMILY FINE ARTS SCHOLARSHIP

West Plains Council on the Arts has been providing support and assistance to arts endeavors in the West Plains area since 1975. Our mission is to stimulate and foster public participation in cultural activities, and to disseminate the knowledge and product of such cultural activities to the public in order to broaden the appreciation and availability of the arts in the West Plains region.

WPCA provides educational programs which support innovation and creative expression in the arts; presents artists and art forms that promote artistic and cultural diversity; provides guidance, resources and infrastructure to develop non-profit community-based arts groups; and sponsors festivals, competitions and awards to promote and support artists, and to celebrate and preserve the traditional culture of the region.

WPCA, in cooperation with the Gatewood Family, has established this scholarship to encourage students of the highest caliber to enter a career in the fine arts, with special emphasis on arts education. This scholarship will be awarded to an area high school senior (graduating 2019) enrolled in a post-secondary program, majoring in fine arts (music or art, performance or education). Education majors will receive higher consideration. Applicant must be a high school student in Howell or Ozark County.

"RECYCLED INTO ART" EXHIBIT AT THE CIVIC CENTER



West Plains Council on the Arts (WPCA) will host an exhibition of works by area students entitled "Recycled Into Art" at the Gallery at the Center, West Plains Civic Center from Earth Day, April 22, through

May 13, 2019. The Gallery, on the mezzanine, is open to the public during regular Civic Center hours.

Students in grades 5-12 from West Plains and the surrounding rural schools will showcase their talents in this unique presentation of artwork using recycled materials. Students have been encouraged to post comments about their pieces and/or components with their artwork.

"As a central focus of Earth Day has often been recycling, we feel this exhibit will help bring home that message and allow our area students to express themselves along this important theme. We are grateful to our area art instructors, who are to be commended for including this project in this year's curriculum," organizers say.

Artwork will be judged on artistic creativity, use of recycled materials, and originality.

WPCA will host an Exhibit Reception on Saturday, April 27, from 2-4 p.m., in the Gallery at the Center. All are invited to attend, view and discuss these wonderful pieces. The exhibit is co-sponsored by the West Plains Civic Center and West Plains Council on the Arts, with partial funding provided by Missouri Arts Council, a state agency.
